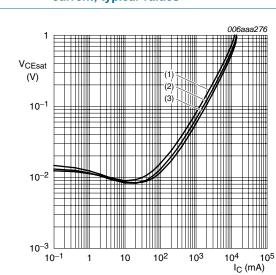

Fig 5. DC current gain as a function of collector current; typical values



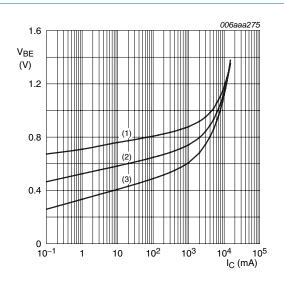

Fig 7. Collector-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values



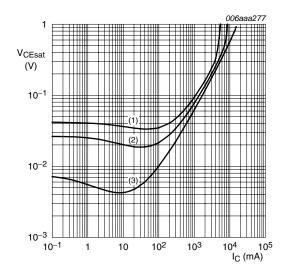

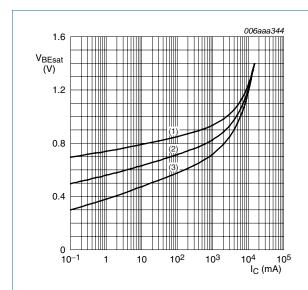

Fig 8. Collector-emitter saturation voltage as a function of collector current; typical values

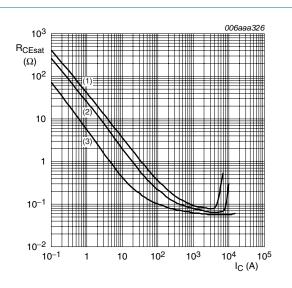

Fig 10. Collector-emitter saturation resistance as a function of collector current; typical values

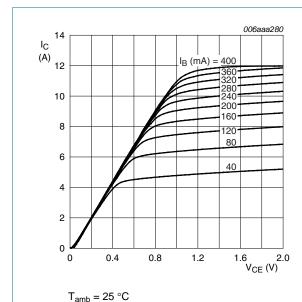
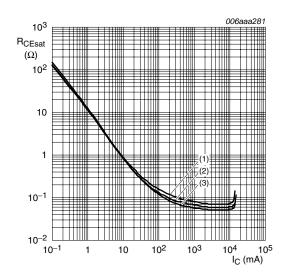


Fig 11. Collector current as a function of collector-emitter voltage; typical values

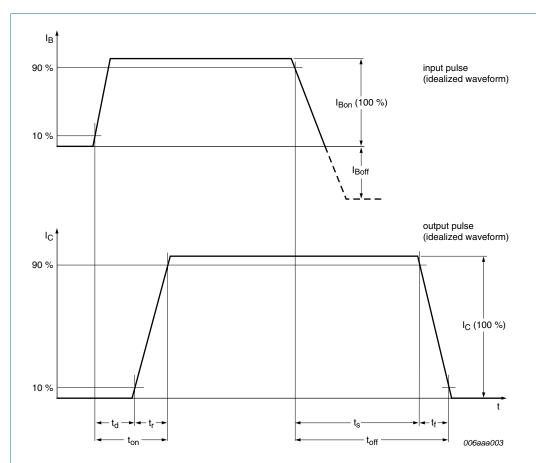
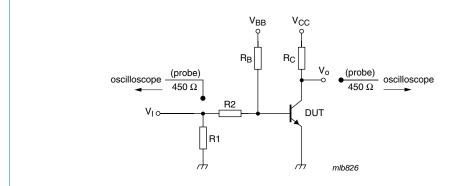


Fig 13. BISS transistor switching time definition



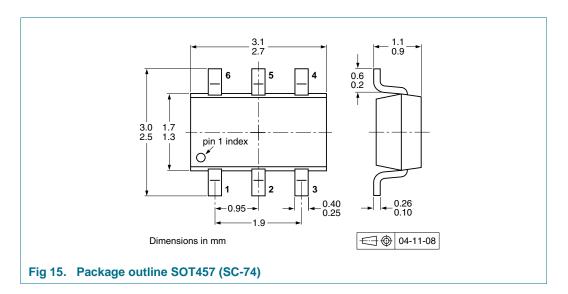
